Greensboro, NC: 9/27/2006: Several veteran Liberian soccer stars have added their names to the list of those supporting the "We Want No More Malaria in Liberia " Campaign by indicating that they will be in Greensboro over the weekend to play a local team, Winston-Salem United, in a special tournament for the converted prize -Pre-Malaria Rally Trophy- organized by LIHEDE as part of the activities of the Rally.

Making up the squad of the veteran team are former players who made their contributions to soccer in Liberia playing for five of Liberian leading first division teams, including Invincible Eleven, Mighty Barrolle, Cedar United, St, Joseph Warriors, and Hafia United. The former players of IE expected to take the soccer pitch are Sarkpha Nyanseor, formerly known as Rock of Gibraltar or Zac Myers, Isaiah Mackintosh and Isaiah Lincoln.

Those coming from the St. Joseph Warriors are Michael Tarplah and Bah Freeman, while the Mighty Barrolle veterans are Roland Brown and Mathor Brown. The Cedar Players are Augustine Allison and Jerry Kandakai. Those from Hafia United are Charles Woefil and Frank Louder.

The names of the players of the Winston-Salem United were not disclosed, but there are indications that the team comprises some local stars who are looking forward to gain respect from the "old-timers" whom they still respect despite age differences.

The Executive Director of LIHEDE, Dr. Syrulwa Somah, said the both sides are already winners in the eyes of the Liberian people, considering that they have decided to be a part of the campaign to eradicate the deadly disease, malaria, from their country without any monetary compensation. "This is the kind of patriotism and love for Liberia we need to bury this disease in the dust bin of history," he initiated.

He explained further that a giant trophy awaits the winner of the special tournament as a reminder that they are part of a global campaign in the fight to combat malaria in developing countries, including Liberia. The tournament will be held on Saturday prior to the Dinner Ball.

The Pre-Malaria Rally is a prelude to the National Health Conference being organized by LIHEDE to be held in Liberia on December 14-19, 2006, in collaboration with the Ministry of Health & Social Welfare through its National Malaria Control program headed by Dr. Joel Jones.

During the event on Saturday, two respectable Liberian Health practitioners, Dr. Wilfred Boayue, and Mr. John Prall, former Register of Births and Deaths, Ministry of Health & Social Welfare, will be honored for their dedicated services to the health care delivery sector of Liberia.

In a related development, all members and officials of LIHEDE, Liberians and friends of Liberia are being encouraged to come to Greensboro this weekend to participate in the Pre-Malaria Conference Rally to be held on Saturday, September 30, 2006 as a show of their support for the eradication of malaria and for the National Health Conference in Liberia under the slogan: "We Want No More Malaria in Liberia."

- BneTV of Canada has agreed to broadcast the entire program world-wide via the Internet. A similar service was performed by BnetTV during the LIHEDE Health Symposium last July in Greensboro, NC
- A soccer game between the "Old Timers" of Lone Star and retired players from England. The famous "Monkey Brown" is expected to serve as referee. 3:00pm to 4:45 PM
- Black Tie/Formal Attire dinner (RSVP for 250 persons) 6:30 PM to 8:45 PM (Speaker II)
- Ball from 10:00 p.m. to wee-wee hour

This precious gift of life is being lost in Liberia where children know little peace, as malaria continues to be a principal killer of our people: 21,500 (MOH, 2006) Liberian children die each year from the curable disease. Across the African Continent, an estimated 500 million people contract malaria every year - up to 3 million die (half of them children), and tens of thousands are left with irreversible brain damage.
